SUMMARY

Introduction

- In order to complement and further enhance the marking of World Maritime Day on 28 September 2006, IMPA, in partnership with the Honourable Company of Master Mariners and in close co-operation with the International Maritime Organization, arranged to jointly host an event on board the vessel **HQS Wellington** to showcase to the media the contribution of the London-based International Shipping Industry.
- The purpose of the event was to support the efforts of the Secretary-General of IMO to raise the profile of shipping by inviting the widest possible media attendance to a series of interesting events in pursuit of the theme of "Technical Co-operation: IMO's response to the 2005 World Summit".

- 5 The organizers specifically invited four schools to send groups of pupils to visit the **HQS Wellington**, with the aim of encouraging the young to pursue a future career at sea.
- A wide range of media representatives from both the print and visual media were invited and attended. Whilst specialized maritime reporters were invited, a principal objective was to appeal to the wider media, to apprise them of the positive aspects of our industry and its contribution to the global economy.

Activities and outcomes of the event

As well as static displays, a number of working craft lay alongside the **HQS Wellington** where a container of twenty foot equivalent unit (TEU) was also on open display, and during the day there were a number of presentations, awards, interviews and broadcasts.

- 8 Coverage in the media has followed the event and further media interest is expected to develop.
- In short, the objectives of holding the event were achieved and the participants are to meet in the next few weeks to consider the possibility of repeating the event as part of future World Maritime Day celebrations.
