## Stakeholder Engagement in Colombia




Basic concept: Maritime and river pilotage encompasses a wide network of interrelated actors and activities that collaborate mutually to facilitate maritime transportation and the distribution of goods.



## Rules governing pilotage in Colombia





The National Maritime Authority constituted by the DIMAR through Port Captaincies determines requirements for granting licenses.



8 classes of piloting maneuvers and 3 categories of maritime pilots are established.

The public pilotage service must be requested directly by the Captain of the vessel or, failing that, by its owner.

#### LAW 658 OF 2001

Pilot training requirements and methodologies.



The way in which security measures are implemented.

The AMN is the competent entity to authorize and register pilotage companies.


